Against the above adventurous bidding, I led a top diamond and was delighted to see Charlie ruff. He returned a spade to my ace and another diamond ruff set the contract two tricks. We were ecstatic and our opponents disgusted with the +200, until it occurred to us that six spades, on our combined 13 points, was unbeatable. In fact, the recap sheet was full of 1210's (six spades doubled) and our score earned only 7 matchpoints on a 25 top! Did YOU find the six spade bid with the West hand?
