THE PHILOSOPHY OF THE ALERT

"The goal of the Alert system is to enable both pairs at the table to have equal access to all information contained in any auction. In order for this goal to be met, it is necessary that all players attempt to understand and practice the principles of full disclosure and active ethics. Actively ethical players will recognize the obligation to give complete explanations and accept the fact that such information is entirely for the benefit of the opponents and may not be used to assist their own partnerships." ACBL Board of Directors

What does this mean to the players? It means that you must tell the opponents what is going on in your auctions. Furthermore, you must go out of your way to tell them by means of a pre-alert if you play any strange method (such as a 6 point notrump range, or something unique such as 1H - 1S - Dbl shows 5-5 or better in the minors).

The alert procedure regarding alerts on strong auctions is changing towards alerts on the tirst round of the auction and explanations regarding individual calls being made at the end of the auction and before the opening lead. The first step on the road to implementing this change has been to make all ace-asking methods (exempting the bizarre) nonalertable after the first round. Full disclosure is then required before the opening lead.

It is hoped that getting the co-operation of all players in following active ethics, the game can allow players to play what they wish to play (within a loose framework) and still give the field a fair chance to compete.
