TEMPO

Mutt and Jeff had cornered the Champ into trying out the new beer at the Rehash Pub. After the new waitress had taken their order and the Champ's name, repeated ten times for clarity, Mutt and Jeff knew that they were there until closing time.

- "Well guys, what's bugging you tonight?" the Champ asked, hoping that the topic would require a lot of pontificating.
- "Me" Mutt said sheepishly "I seem to be having an awful lot of problems and poor old

Jeff keeps complaining about having to handle my balks and of course some of the players are beginning to make remarks so we thought that we would consult with you."

Since the waitress was bringing their beer, the Champ started on his mission to inform. "Unless I miss my bet you guys are talking about balks which occur during the auction as opposed to the style of breaks that occur during play." Mutt nodded his assent.

"Let's talk first about auctions when partner balks, and then passes. Then we'll discuss situations when partner hesitates and then bids something other then pass, OK?" "Great." Mutt muttered through his beer.

"The key issue in all hesitating situations is whether or not the balk suggests a specific course of action should be selected as opposed to suggesting many choices may be taken. When partner balks then passes then the action you take must be clearly based on the assets in your own hand and not some goodie that might show up in partner's hand. Here are some easy examples: you open 1 Spade, 1 NT by LHO, (long pause) Pass by partner, Pass by RHO and you hold AJXXX KJXX AX XX What do you bid?"

"2 Hearts." Mutt queried. "Yeah!" Jeff interjected "now you can get yelled at!"

" And rightly so" the Champ took over. " Here you have a minimum 2 suited hand sitting under the strong NT overcall, which means your values are badly placed. Despite holding a second suit, pass would be the normal call and would be accepted as a call whereas 2 Hearts would be the choice of a minority and would not be acceptable because partner's hesitation has suggested that your side has the values to compete. Now suppose partner passed quickly rather than slowly (which he should not do), you would now know that bidding 2 Hearts would be very risky so you would casually pass and not get into trouble. This is unauthorized information and gives your side an undeserved advantage over your opponents. This is the reason why bridge laws have evolved to this treatment after a balk.

AJXXX KJX AX XXX This time you open 1 Spade, Pass, 2 Diamonds (game force), 3 Clubs and you hesitate and correctly or not you pass. Partner should assume you have a semi balanced minimum opener and since partner has already promised game going values almost any action consistent with that assumption could be chosen without a problem

although making a penalty double with a club void would cause eyebrows to be raised. But if partner passed, treating my opener as a psyche and was correct, our partnership would be facing an ethic's committee and if he passed but was wrong partner would still be in trouble since fielding a psyche without it being CLEAR that only partner could be psyching is illegal.

AJXXX KJXX AX XX. Now we will go back to our first example but change the auction to 1 Spade, Pass, 2 Diamonds (long pause), 2 Hearts and assuming double in this sequence is a penalty double, would both of you double or would you find another call?"

"What else?" Jeff agreed. "Well I might bid 3 NT if we are vulnerable and they aren't." Mutt put forth.

"OK those are both reasonable, but you see the point is partner's balk doesn't bar you from taking action, the balk merely restricts you to reasonable or non-suggested bids.

AXXXX AKXX AQ XX. This time with the opponents silent, the auction goes 1 Spade, 2 Clubs (game force), 2 Hearts, 2 Spades, 4 NT (regular Blackwood), 5 Diamonds, 5 NT, 6 Hearts (long pause). Your bid guys." Jeff looked puzzled and then grinned and said: "I know what's coming. Partner's balk could only mean that he is thinking of bidding the grand himself so you can deduce that partner has solid clubs and great spades. Since I learned that through the balk I can only bid 6 Spades. Right?"

"You got it" the Champ said "but I must leave now" as the waitress gave him the bill with the comment that she had to collect as she had finished her shift and.....
