This was played on Sunday Evening February 15th, 1998, at the recent Edmonton Sectional Tournament.

Board: 5

Game: Matchpoints

Dealer: North


Vulnerability: North-South

Contract: 6NT
Declarer: South

West preempted in diamonds during the auction, but for simplicity the hand is presented as double dummy!

Looking at all four hands, who's side would you like to be on? Do you want to declare or defend? Please take a moment or 15 minutes (!) before you watch the drama unfold.

- 1. Assuming we play the clubs correctly, we only have 11 tricks top tricks because the hearts do not break 3-3. So we would rather defend? Right? Wrong!
- When we knock out the Ace of Clubs, East will presumably lead a diamond through the Ace-Queen of Diamonds. Then we cash all the clubs and all the spades, leaving everyone with four cards. Dummy has AQ85 of Hearts. Declarer has K4 of Hearts and Q7 of Diamonds. What are West's four cards? He needs to keep his four Hearts and King of Diamonds. He is subjected to a simple squeeze. So we would rather declare? Right? Wrong!
- 3. What happens if West leads a heart, and then when East wins the Ace of Clubs he continues with a Heart? This breaks-up the squeeze because there is no entry to the Heart threat. So, we would rather defend? Right? Wrong!
- All declarer needs to do is ensure that he wins Trick 10 in the other wise entryless Dummy, after cashing all the black cards. Obviously to accomplish this, Declarer must cash the Spades before the Clubs. Now Dummy will have A8 of Hearts and the 6 of Diamonds. Declarer will have AQ7 of Diamonds. Again West is squeezed he cannot keep two Hearts and protect his King of Diamonds. So we would rather declare? Right? Wrong!
- East, seeing all this (!), ducks the Queen of Clubs to prevent the King of Clubs from becoming a later entry. Now when Declarer leads to the King of Clubs, West wins and continues with a heart. Declarer can no longer **both** take the marked Club finesse **and** end up in Dummy after trick 10. So we would rather defend? Right? Wrong!
- 6. After the Queen of Clubs holds, Declare leads to the King of Spades and leads the 8 of Clubs. East ducks. Then Dummy leads the 2 of Clubs towards Declarer's Jack. Again East must duck, because as we have seen, if Dummy's King of Clubs is an entry, then the squeeze will work. So East, by ducking three times, has brilliantly defeated the contract. Still want to defend? Right? Wrong!



7. After cashing the remaining spades, this position is reached:

There are now several ways to make the contract of 6NT:

- A) Play Ace of Hearts, Queen of Hearts and another Heart, end-playing West to lead into the Ace-Queen of Diamonds.
- B) Play Ace of Hearts, Ace of Diamonds and another Diamond, endplaying West to lead into the Queen-eight of Hearts.
- C) Lead the seven of Clubs. East wins and West is suicide-squeezed at the same time. What ignominy! But I suppose that East might just cash his good Spade. Whoops!!
