STANDING ON THE PRECIPICE

In bridge, it is an accepted truth that when a partnership bids too much, failure is inevitable unless declarer plays the hand with such skill that all bad bids are forgiven. On the hand below, you reach Five Hearts after your non-vulnerable right hand opponent opens One spade and there is a preemptive raise by LHO to Three Spades. The lead is the Two of Spades.

Contract: 5 Hearts
Lead: 2 of Spades
Auction: Optimistic

With a normal 2-1 break in the trump suit, the hand has the potential for twelve tricks. Just pull two rounds of trumps, cross to the dummy with a third round of trumps and lead the Queen of Clubs. Assuming the King of Clubs is on your right, twelve tricks come home any time the Club Ten starts out doubleton (with the King or not) or the QJ of Diamonds are doubleton.

The play proceeds. RHO wins the King of Spades at trick one and leads the Ace of Spades. You ruff and lead the Ace of Hearts. To your dismay, LHO discards a small Spade! Just moments ago twelve tricks seemed possible and now your five level contract looks to be in dire jeopardy. What are your options?

Obviously, if the QJ of Diamonds are doubleton any line of play rates to succeed. You know the Queen of trumps is onside and the King of Clubs rates to be onside as well. The key is to force an entry to dummy, either in Clubs to take the trump finesse or in trumps to take the Club finesse. But what if the QJ of Diamonds are <u>not</u> doubleton? You need to be able to get rid of one of dummy's Diamonds to make your contract.

Option #1 is to lead a Club towards the Queen. If LHO has the King, the Queen of Clubs will become an entry to finesse against the trump Queen and the Ace of Clubs will take care of one of dummy's diamonds.

Option #2 is to lead the Jack of Hearts at trick three and let RHO win a trump trick. Ruff the expected Spade return (or win a Diamond return) and use a small Heart to simultaneously pull the last trump and enter dummy. Now lead the Queen of Clubs for the finesse. This line wins when the King of Clubs is onside and the Ten of Clubs is doubleton. But did you remember to ruff the second spade with the J or T of Hearts??

Fortunately, there is a much better line of play than either of these options. Lead the Jack of Clubs from your hand at trick three.

You do not care who has the King of Clubs—eleven tricks are almost guaranteed! If either opponent wins the King of Clubs, the Queen of Clubs becomes an entry to take the known trump finesse and the Ace of Clubs lets you discard dummy's third Diamond. If the Jack of Clubs wins, ruff the third round of Clubs in dummy and take the trump finesse—you can afford to lose a Diamond trick! There's just one small glitch. If RHO holds Kx of Clubs and is good enough to refuse to win the Jack of Clubs, you will fail to make Five Hearts. When you try to ruff the third round of Clubs, RHO will overruff and you will still have a Diamond to lose. Should this happen, you will have learned a valuable lesson — play in an easier game or don't overbid against strong opposition!

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE


