IN MEMORIAM

John Davison (1948-1999)

We regret to report the demise of the popular ACBL director, teacher and player Mr. John Davison-known to most of us by his nickname - JD - on August 23, 1999 after the onset of two forms of cancer.

John began directing in clubs in the mid - 1970's; he was promoted to sectional director in 1985 and subsequently worked at the NABC's in the early 1990's. JD's personality was very special in that he was able - as a director - to make rulings and resolve disputes among players without creating any enemies for himself. John was also a bridge teacher with a deep theoretical and practical interest in bridge systems. JD's teaching ability enabled his students to attain higher levels of bridge skill through his regular classes at the Bow River Bridge Club. Many of us will also remember his post-game insights into the play of the cards.

JD's professional career did not prevent him from being a keen competitor. One of his proud achievements was to be the playing captain of the winning team in the Flight A VP Swiss in the Alberta Regional in Edmonton in July this year.

John held an MA degree in linguistics and had a linguist's knowledge of Spanish, French, German, Latin, and other languages, but his specialty was the grammar of Halkomelem Salish, a Native Canadian language. John's love of language extended to limericks, wordplay, puns and jokes that were often risqué.

JD enjoyed good food, good bridge and good friends. He acquired an extensive collection of vintage wines to enhance the aforementioned. He loved the music of Gilbert and Sullivan. We all appreciated his bright, colorful personality, which was accented by his flamboyant ties.

During John's illness there was a large outpouring of affection and support from all the members of Unit 390. Many volunteers who assuredly lightened the load of his daily tasks and health care in his last months assisted him. John is survived by his mother in Victoria, two siblings, his good friend the linguist John Archibald, and by his special friend Jean Bachinsky.






North Calgary Ladies

The North Calgary Ladies have been playing at the Martinique Bridge Studio since October 1st 1999.

PLAYS AT TRICK ONE (SOLUTIONS)

Hand One: The safest play is to duck the $\forall K$ lead. If hearts are continued, ruff in your hand, pull trumps, cross to dummy in clubs and pitch your diamond loser on the $\forall A$. Even at matchpoints, this would be the best play since you cannot establish the hearts and pitch your diamond loser on them. (Not enough entries to dummy). But if you play the $\forall A$ at trick one, it might get ruffed.

Hand Two: The best play is to put up the $\diamond Q$ from the dummy. East can win with his $\diamond A$ but cannot harm you (If East shifts to a spade, go up with the Ace and tinesse in clubs). If you play dummy's $\diamond T$ at trick one, East will play his Jack, then if East has the $\bigstar K$ and West has the $\bigstar K$, you will go down.



Hand Three: If you play a diamond honor from dummy, East will win and shift to a trump. After the defense take their two trump tricks, you can only get nine tricks. But if you play low from dummy, you frustrate the defenders. East cannot overtake since this would generate an extra diamond trick. The best the defense can do is win the $\bullet J$ and shift to a club. You win the $\bullet A$ and the $\P A$ and ruff a heart. You play the $\bullet K$ covered by the Ace and you ruff. Ruff another heart and pitch your losing club on the $\bullet Q$. Ruff a club and ruff your last heart in the dummy. You still lose two trumps and a diamond but you managed to keep East (the danger hand) out of the lead since you did not want a trump play from East. If West underled his $\bullet A$ at trick one, congratulate him on his fine play, but then you might only loose one trump trick.
