### Martinique: What's in a Name?

The Martinique derived its name from founder Jack L. Martin (1919 - 1997) who established the club in early 1954 (probably...) at his home at 633 - 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW. This date is "probable" because the name does not appear in the November 1953 AGT Directory, but 'Martinique Bridge Club Studio' does appear in the AGT Directory for July 1954. The Martins lived upstairs and hosted bridge on the main floor. A distant reminder of that era was the switch from 6 digit phone numbers to exchanges in early 1958 when the Martinique's changed from 692061 to AMhurst 9-2061.

In late 1959 or early 1960, Jack relocated the club to the basement at 817 - 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW (below Fernando's Hideaway Restaurant). In late 1963 or early 1964 the club again relocated, this time to the main floor at 715 - 10<sup>th</sup> Street SW (where Westmount Place condominiums now stand).

Jack had been an accountant and assessor for Dominion Income Tax and had a facility with numbers. He was known as an excellent teacher of duplicate bridge at the intermediate and advanced levels, strongly emphasizing mathematics -- percentages, safety plays, and so on. He even taught bridge on the Calgary TV station and wrote a bridge column in the Albertan. As mentioned in an obituary in the Ontario Kibitzer (Summer 1998, Volume 44, No. 2), Jack was also "an accomplished trumpet player and a lifelong fan of Billie Holiday and Dixieland jazz".

Walt G. Alex (1924 - ) acquired the Martinique c1965. The June 1965 AGT Directory shows a slight name change to 'Martinique Bridge Studio' and this might have been made by Walt. The club remained at the 10<sup>th</sup> Street location for another 12 years. The 10<sup>th</sup> Street Martinique received some interesting publicity when Ike Landon won \$10,000 in a package of cigarettes and insisted he had purchased the lucky pack at the Martinique. The cigarettes actually had been bought at a drug store but the story sure livened up the bridge table chatter for some period of time!

Walt operated a couple of lucrative aligned businesses at that time: Canadian Bridge Supplies (created by Walt in 1960 and sold to Don and Louise Holtom in 1988), and a coffee shop venture at the Martinique premises. The latter primarily served Mount Royal College students at lunchtime--the campus was then located at 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 11<sup>th</sup> Street--until the College relocated to its present location.

Walt taught a lot of novice and intermediate bridge in the early years. Joyce Millward was a bridge teacher of towering strength in that Martinique era, providing a wide range of bridge education including 'chalk talk' sessions before each novice game. Joyce was the third Albertan to become an ACBL Life Master. When Joyce died c1986, the 'Queen of Hearts' game, complete with trophies for the winners, was established in her honour and held at the Martinique for many subsequent Valentine's Days.

In late 1978 or early 1979 Walt moved the Martinique to the lower floor of 1134 – 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW. At the time, land was being assembled for the Westmount project so the club needed to relocate. Walt was a tremendously helpful man. He was an expert at minimizing controversy and resolving table issues. He was especially encouraging to novices. Walt liked parties, and may have been the originator of the annual Martinique Christmas Party. Two of the signature games Walt started were the Saturday evening 'Hot Dog' game which ran for many years and the popular Wednesday evening rookie-master Handicap Game (no two Life Masters could play together).

Walt directed most of the games and Marguerite Swanson (Perry) and Helen Walker also directed. Walt encouraged Marguerite to take her Director's certificate and just a month after she passed the exam, Walt and his new bride took a month-long trip to Australia, giving Marguerite the opportunity to "fly solo".

The 10<sup>th</sup> Street site is where Rick Tewari taught lessons for several years. Rick made many contributions, one of which was to 'recycle' 30 or so of the trophies he had won at Sectionals by removing his name and awarding them to his students for their bridge achievements.

Arlene and Pat Todd with Joan Severin purchased the Martinique from Walt in 1980. After a few months,

Joan transferred her shares to Dave and Hattie Whitmore and the Todd/Whitmore partnership operated the Martinique for the next 7 or 8 years. In the fall of 1981 or spring of 1982, the Martinique was relocated to the basement of 213 - 19<sup>th</sup> Street NW (now Patricia Plaza). In early 1985, the Martinique moved again, this time to the Knights of Columbus Hall, its current location at 2419 - 54 Avenue SW.

Stan Matheson, Maureen Bailey, John Davison, and Gord Sharp (as well as Pat and Dave) directed games for the Todd/Whitmore ownership. In about 1987 the Martinique was sold to a consortium: Gord Sharp, Lois Dunsmore, Brenda Murchison, Maureen Bailey and Les Nordlund. Les' shares were acquired c1988 by Frank Ayer and Alex Knox.

Delores Hedley and Gord purchased everyone's shares c1989 and operated the Martinique for the next few years. Gord was an exceptional bridge teacher and an early proponent of 2 over 1. He created a 2 over 1 course that many studied at that time, and the course materials continue to be useful today.

In 1992 Gord and Delores sold the business to Barbara Webster who brought Dann Kramer (from Edmonton) into the partnership in 1995. When Stan and Barbara migrated to BC, her shares were purchased by Brenda Bertrand. In 1998, Dann sold his shares to Elaine Stewart and John Hinde. Maureen Bailey acquired Elaine and John's shares in September 2001 and that brings the ownership records up to date. Brenda and Maureen are the current owners.

Half a century after its creation, the Martinique is today the largest club in Calgary, serving about 500 players each week. Its energy and focus have been inspired by some 20 shareholders and even more game Directors. Currently, 13+ games are directed by Brenda, Maureen, Pat Purvis, Michael Farebrother, Barry Pashak, Martin McDonald, Dann Kramer and Jan McLeod.

And of course, there are the thousands and thousands of players who have loved every moment of their Martinique experience as the club has, and continues to, evolve. What's in a name like 'Martinique'? A lot!

#### 2006 Hattie Joffe Race

Propelled by a win in the Evening Knock Outs and second place finishes in Wednesday's Open Pairs and Sunday's Flight A Swiss, Unit 390's own Steve Lawrence earned 74.77 masterpoints and walked away with the 2006 Hattie Joffe trophy.

The Hattie Joffe Memorial Trophy is awarded each year to the Albertan winning the most masterpoints during the annual Alberta Regional Bridge Tournament. The trophy was donated by Hattie's son Jay in memory of his mother.

Hattie Joffe (1903 - 1982) was a prominent Calgary bridge player in the 1950's, 60's and 70's. She was the first ACBL Life Master from Alberta.

Hattie (Henrietta) was born in Calgary, worked as a private detective in Vancouver and sold insurance in Drumheller before returning to Calgary where she and her family lived on 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue. As a young woman, she was a speed skater, spending many days at the Crystal Rink, then on the downtown side of the Louise Bridge. In WWII Hattie won a prize for selling war bonds. She was very athletic, curled, was active in the community, and, of course, played bridge morning, noon and night.

Pat Smolensky, a long-time bridge partner of Hattie's, recalls her as a taskmaster and true friend. Pat attributes her own quick success to Hattie, who took her under her wings and provided relentless encouragement.

#### Ladies First

You've made the final of the World Mixed Pairs (Verona, Italy, June 2006) and every hand is an adventure because you encounter all sorts of systems, strangers and languages. Inexplicably, the World Bridge Federation insists that women sit South or East, and men sit North or West. True, this ensures a gender mix on each side of the screen, but it makes no more sense than using age or height to determine seating.

Scores are entered using a hand-held computer (one per table) and you immediately learn your matchpoint score on a board based on the results from tables that have played the hand thus far.

On this deal, you hold a modest collection:

♠65 ♥Q8653 ♠Q10984 ♣J

and hear the following auction:

**Dealer**: North **Vulnerable**: Both

<u>You</u>	<u>West</u>	<u>Partner</u>	<u>East</u>
Pass	1.	1♥	1♠
4♥	Pass	Pass	4♠
<b>333</b>			


You were afraid this would happen! Playing IMPs, you would feel comfortable bidding  $5 \checkmark$ . The potential swing is giving up 300 or 600 (the penalty for going down in  $5 \checkmark$  plus the 100 you could have gained for defeating  $4 \spadesuit$ ). But the upside is losing only 200 or 500 when the opponents can make +620.

At matchpoints, the decision is more difficult. Going down in  $5 \checkmark$  rates to be a near bottom if the opponents can't make  $4 \spadesuit$ . Occasionally, you will stampede the opponents into bidding  $5 \spadesuit$ , but your LHO has been featured prominently in a number of your bridge magazines so this doesn't seem likely!

After this moment of self-torture (remember, tempo is critical if you want to give partner free rein to exercise all his options), you pull out the "Pass" card, as does everyone else. Now what to lead?


Hugh Kelsey, in his book called "Killing Defense", discusses this theme. Sometimes, there is no indication of which of the off-suits you ought to lead. If you could lay down an ace and have a look at dummy, that might help. You have no ace, unfortunately, but the lead of the VQ might serve just as well.

You duly strike with the ♥Q and see the dummy (hands rotated for convenience):



Partner plays the  $\checkmark$ 10, which by agreement asks for the higher ranking suit. Declarer follows with the  $\checkmark$ 9. You switch to the  $\checkmark$ Q. Why the Q? If declarer has  $\checkmark$ J, she is unlikely to misguess. If partner has  $\checkmark$ J then you will avoid causing partner any stress. On this hand, partner cashes A, then  $\checkmark$ J and unsuccessfully tries to score the  $\checkmark$ K. There are no more tricks for the defence.

#### Post Mortem:

It turned out that much of what was lost in the auction was regained on the opening lead. Bidding on to  $5 \checkmark$  netted 88%. Holding  $4 \spadesuit$  to four was worth 76%. The deal was played 92 times: 11 times in  $5 \spadesuit$ , 61 times in  $4 \spadesuit$  and 20 times in other contracts.

Four times (because some of the competitors were playing transfer responses after overcalls), the spade contracts were declared by West, in which case only the unlikely underlead from  $\checkmark$ AK could prevent declarer from making five. Of the remaining 68 times, the  $\checkmark$ Q was led just twice (once an unusual  $\checkmark$  was led, perhaps in sheer desperation or in response to a farsighted diamond bid from North along the way). On the orthodox lead of a fourth best heart, partner must win and cash the  $\checkmark$ A or lose it!!!

Remember Kelsey's tip: Playing an unsupported high card might enable you to stay on lead to the next trick, allowing partner to signal for the best switch.



"Maybe your partner needs to find a different way of expressing himself when he doesn't agree with your bidding."
